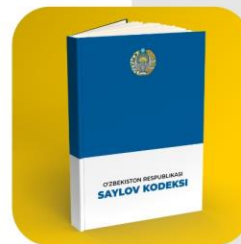

CALLING EARLY PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS OF THE REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN

- ✓ The President shall have the right to call early presidential elections

Article 128 of the Constitution

- ✓ Should the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan call early presidential elections, they shall be held within two months in full compliance with the Election Code

- ✓ The Central Election Commission shall determine the schedule for preparing and holding the elections

Article 66 of the Election Code of the Republic of Uzbekistan



CALLING EARLY PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS OF THE REPUBLIC OF UZBEKISTAN

- ✓ The President of the Republic of Uzbekistan has taken the initiative to call early presidential elections
- ✓ In accordance with Presidential Decree No. UP -68 dated May 8, 2023, it was decided to hold early presidential elections



RIGHT TO VOTE



Citizens declared by the court legally incapable and persons serving a prison sentence for serious and grave crimes may be deprived of the right to vote only by the law and based on the court decision



A citizen of the Republic of Uzbekistan who has attained the age of **eighteen years** on the Election Day is entitled to vote



A citizen of the Republic of Uzbekistan **who resides or stays outside the territory** of the Republic of Uzbekistan has the full right to vote in elections

According to the Calendar Plan of the Central Election Commission for the early presidential election, the establishment of the election districts was set at least **55 days** before the elections



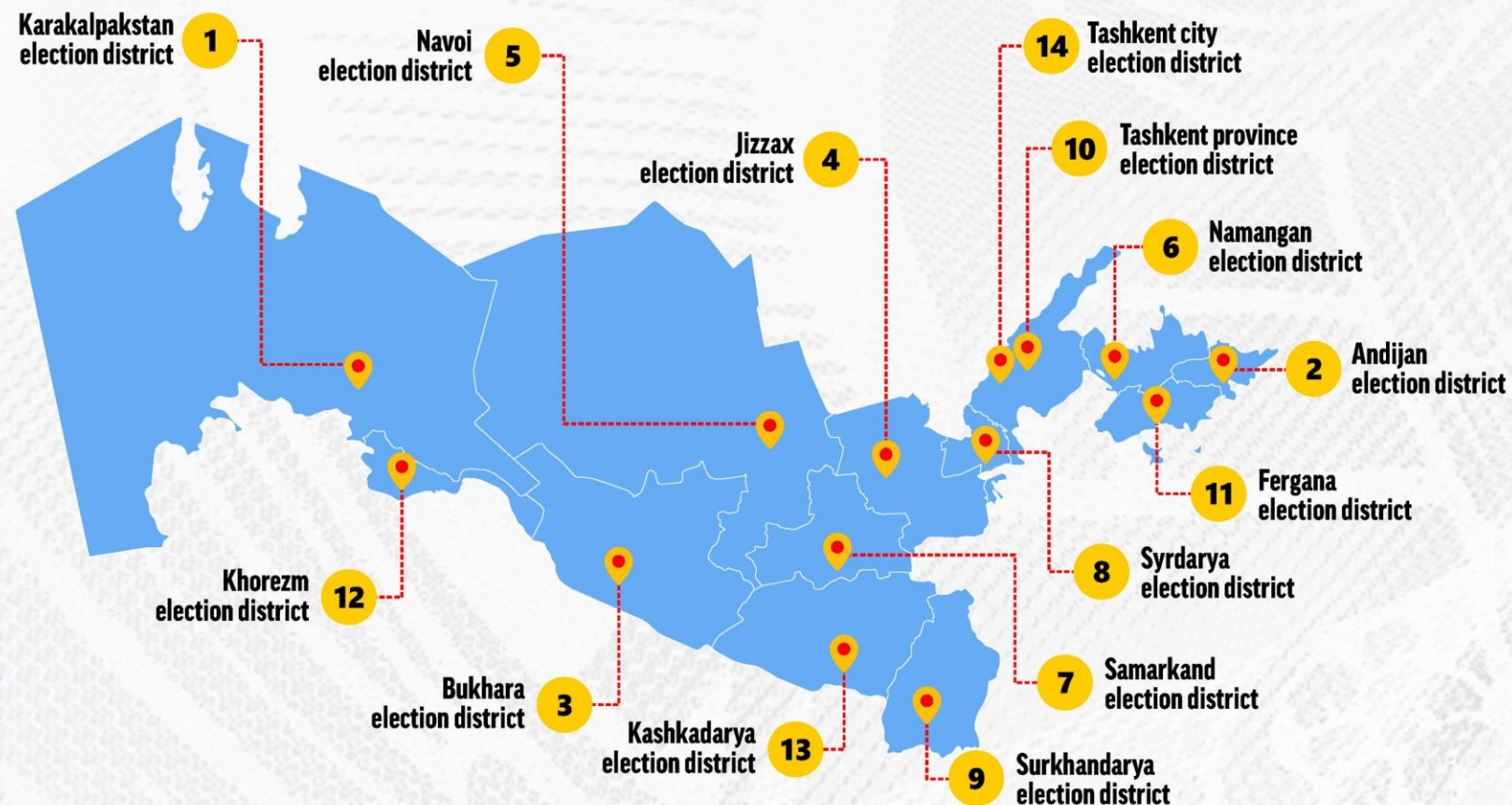

ESTABLISHMENT OF ELECTION PRECINCTS

- ✓ A Precinct Election Commission is formed by the District Election Commission No later than **forty days** before the election



Election precincts shall be formed with a **minimum of twenty and a maximum of three thousand** voters

Election precincts shall also be established in the following locations



In military units



In sanatoriums and rest homes



In hospitals and other inpatient medical institutions



Places where citizens stay in remote or inaccessible areas

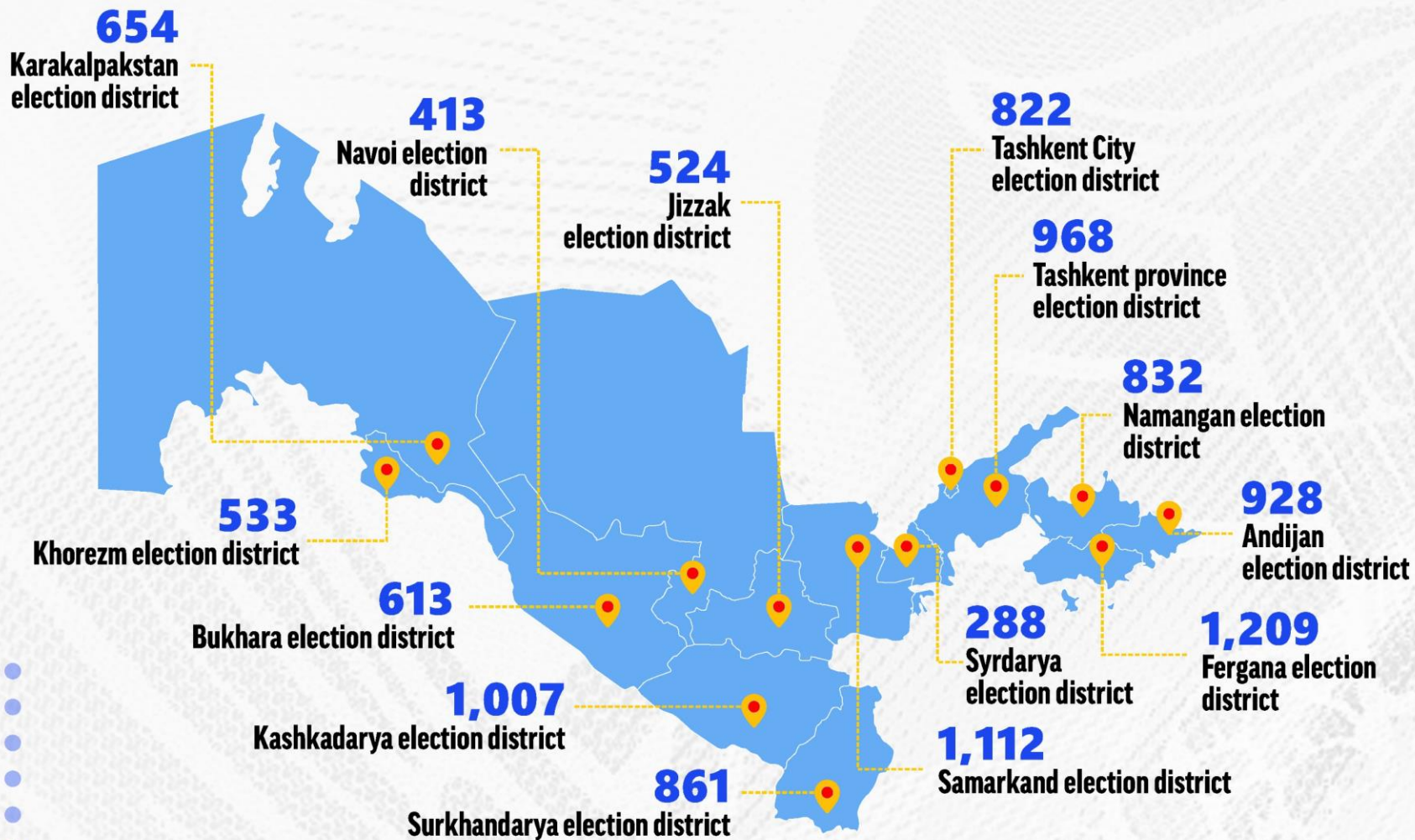


In centers of detention or deprivation of liberty

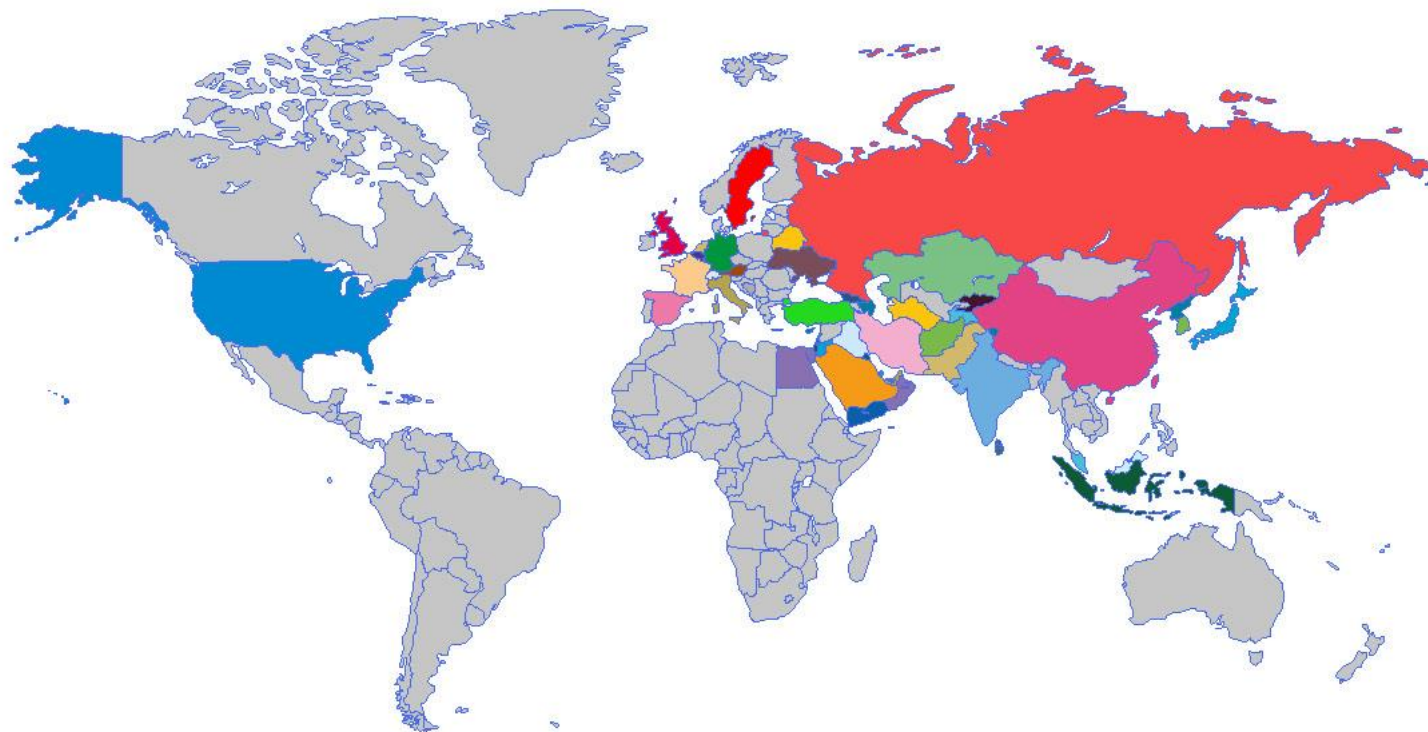

TRAINING FOR MEMBERS OF ELECTION COMMISSIONS

- ✓ In accordance with the Central Election Commission Resolution No. 1261 of May 19, 2023, a Concept of Organizing the Training of the Members of the Commissions for the Early Elections of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan was adopted

THE FIRST AREA

ORGANIZATIONAL AND METHODOLOGICAL WORK

- ✓ A group of experts was formed, consisting of specialists from the Central Election Commission, the Academy of Public Administration, the Tashkent State University of Law, the Law Enforcement Academy, and the University of Public Security

- ✓ National, regional (provincial), and district (city) headquarters were established to coordinate the organization and delivery of training in collaboration with relevant ministries and agencies

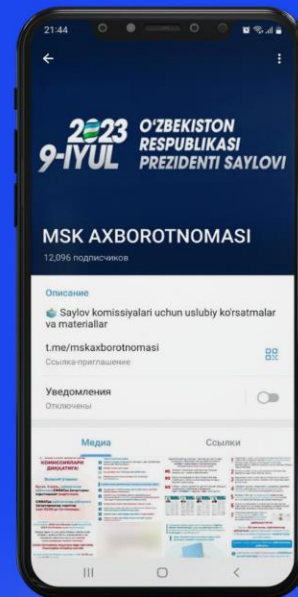
The mobile application "Elections-2023" was developed jointly with the Ministry of Digital Technology

THE WORKING MECHANISM OF THE ELECTORAL PROCESS MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM



Lists of voters in the elections were prepared on the basis of the Single Electronic Voter Register (SEVR)



The SEVR was created within the framework of the Electoral Process Management Information System (EPMIS)



- ✓ **Ministry of Interior** (information on residential address, persons deprived of liberty, persons duly deprived of citizenship)
- ✓ **Ministry of Defense, Ministry of Interior, National Guard, Customs, and Ministry of Emergencies** (members of the armed forces, military service members, and students in the educational institutions of the organization's system)
- ✓ **Ministry of Foreign Affairs** (travelling abroad)
- ✓ **Ministry of Justice** (deceased)
- ✓ **Land registry** (cadastral number)

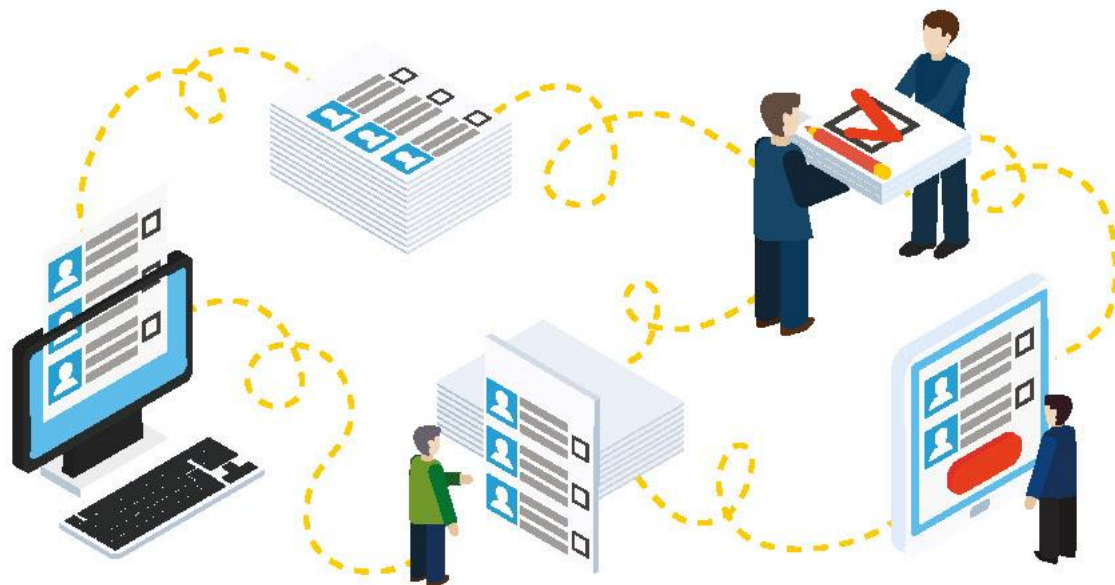

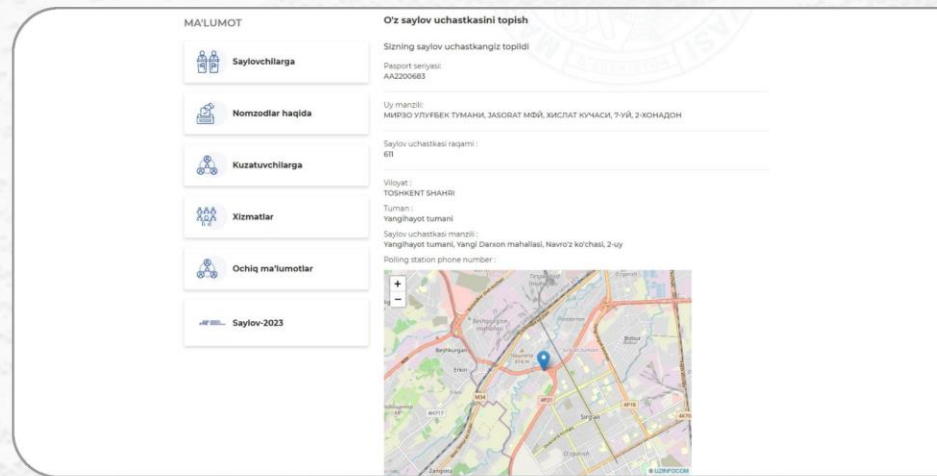

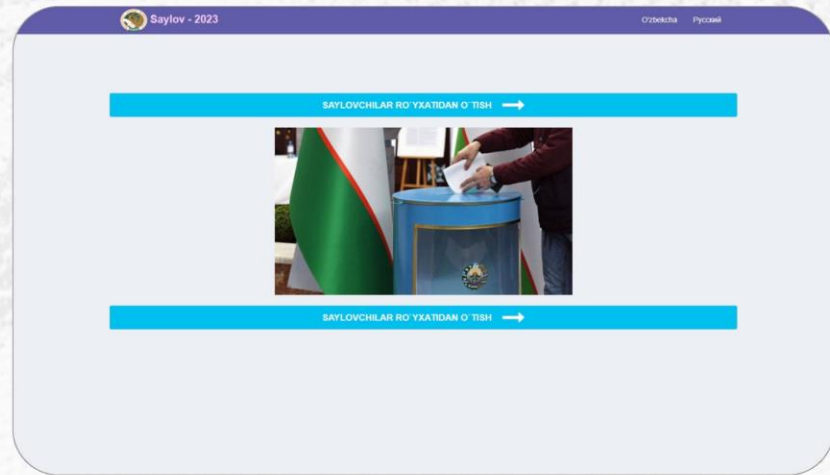


DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES IN ELECTORAL PROCESSES

The website of the Central Election Commission and the Single Portal of Interactive Public Services (my.gov.uz), have introduced digital services **“Identification of Election Precinct”** and **“Submission of a request to change the election precinct”**



On the official website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (saylov.mfa.uz), a service for submitting electronic applications for registration in the list of voters of election precincts established in diplomatic missions and institutions abroad was launched



DIGITAL TECHNOLOGIES IN ELECTORAL PROCESSES

In order to broadcast the voting process in real time (online) on election day, up to **2 election** precincts located in **208 districts** and cities in the Republic were equipped with **video cameras**



- ✓ Thus, the election process could be followed in real time (online) on screens in the Press Centre of the Central Election Commission, on the official website **saylov.uz** and on the **O'zbekiston 24** channel of the Uzbek National Television and Radio Company, as well as on other TV channels

- ✓ A biometric identification system for Voters on Election Day was piloted at **50 election** precincts located in the **14th Tashkent City District**



ELECTION CAMPAIGN

- ✓ Election campaign is an activity conducted during the election aimed at encouraging voters to vote for a candidate or political party.
- ✓ Election campaign shall begin on the next day after the deadline for candidate registration.
- ✓ No campaigning is permitted on election day or on the day before voting.

Article 44 of the Election Code

- ✓ The election campaign shall be conducted through the mass media, telecommunications networks and the World Wide Web, through the production and distribution of printed, visual, audiovisual and other campaign materials (posters, leaflets and other materials), and through meetings with voters.

Article 45 of the Election Code

OPENNESS AND TRANSPARENCY

Accreditation Commissions:

- ✓ observers from other countries, international organizations and media representatives - **CEC**
- ✓ observers from political parties, citizens' self-governing bodies, - **competent district commissions**

Accreditation documents shall be accepted at least **10 days** before the elections

So far, **1,400 representatives** of local and foreign media have been accredited

OPENNESS AND TRANSPARENCY



Meetings of the Central Election Commission related to the conduct and preparation of the elections were broadcast live via social media **with sign language interpretation**



SMS messages reminding citizens of Election Day were sent to their mobile phones



Leaflets explaining the voting procedure abroad on Election Day were prepared and distributed to Uzbek citizens travelling abroad, **posters** calling for participation in the elections in **A1, A2 and A3 formats**, and **invitations** for citizens taking part in the elections

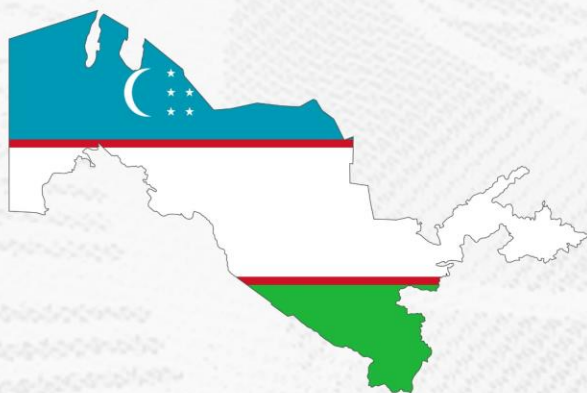
**FREE AIRTIME ALLOCATED TO
CANDIDATES FOR CAMPAIGNING**





On each of the TV channels
“O‘zbekiston 24”,
“O‘zbekiston”, “Yoshlar”,
“Mahalla” each candidate
was allocated **90 minutes** of
free airtime in the first week
of the campaign and
30 minutes in weeks 2-5

In addition to the free airtime allocated, the political parties’ TV and radio spots are aired in a single block of **120 seconds** (30 seconds for each party) **four times a day on each channel**



A total of **1,400 minutes** of airtime,
100 minutes per candidate, was
allocated on all 14 regional
NTRC TV channels



Each candidate was also allocated **2 minutes of airtime** (62 minutes total) on each **local TV** and radio channel during the campaign for video and radio spots

FREE PRINT SPACE ALLOCATED TO CANDIDATES

- ✓ **One page** per candidate in the national newspapers **Yangi O'zbekiston, Pravda Vostoka, Xalq So'zi** and **Narodnoe Slovo**
- ✓ In the newspapers **Ovozi Tojik** and **Nurly Zhol**, half a page of print space was allocated for each party
- ✓ In local newspapers, **2-4 pages** are allocated to each party **per week**, depending on the format of the newspaper



INFORMATION CAMPAIGN



- ✓ **691,314** copies of **informational posters** with the biographies of the presidential candidates and a summary of the election programme were posted



- ✓ A total of **388,578 posters** calling to vote



- ✓ Invitation banners were displayed on **966 billboards** across the country, as well as on **1,317 outdoor advertising monitors**, in subway stations, in subway trains, and on buses in Tashkent, and video clips with **appeals** to vote were shown

CREATING FACILITIES FOR VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES



A template for the ballot was printed in Braille. Each election precinct was equipped **with the template** so that blind and visually impaired citizens could express their will on the ballot paper themselves



Specially **equipped secret voting booths** for people with disabilities were placed in the election precincts. **Optical magnifiers and lamps** were provided at election precincts for blind and visually impaired voters



The meetings of the Central Election Commission **with sign language interpretation** can be followed directly through the TV channels and the social media pages of the CEC

VOTING ORGANIZATION



Early voting



A voter who **cannot be at his or her place of residence** on Election Day is entitled to vote early



Early voting begins **10 days before** and ends 3 days before Election Day



Early voting was conducted this year from **June 28** to **July 5** for voters who could not be at their place of residence on Election Day

Voting by voters residing abroad



In accordance with international treaties of the Republic of Uzbekistan and agreements with authorized public authorities of foreign states, **early voting in densely populated areas of foreign states** may be conducted at the **voter's place of residence or work**

VOTING ORGANIZATION

Voting on Election Day



Voting will take place **from 8:00 to 20:00** on Election Day



The citizen presents an identification document to a member of the Precinct Election Commission and signs the list of voters. The voter then is handed a ballot paper

Voting at place of residence



In cases where individual voters are **unable to come to the polling station** due to health or other reasons, the competent Precinct Election Commission member, upon the request of such voters, **organizes voting at their place of residence**

DETERMINATION OF VOTING RESULTS



At 20:00, the PEC **announces the end of voting** and counts the votes



The results of the vote count are **recorded in the Protocol** of the District Election Commission



The Protocol is forwarded to the **District Election Commission** in accordance with established procedures



The District Election Commission records the results of the precinct vote count in the **Protocol of the District Election Commission** and forwards it to the Central Election Commission



Copies of Precinct and District Election Commission Protocols are posted in the building of the Commission for at least **48 hours**



ANNOUNCEMENT OF ELECTION RESULTS

The Central Election Commission announces the decision on the results of the presidential election on its official website and other sources no later than **10 days** after the election



HANDLING OF APPEALS

Appeals to the Election Commissions



Local observers, voters, and other election participants may address requests, proposals, and complaints directly to the election commissions, either themselves or through their representatives



Appeals may be submitted in the following forms: **verbally, in writing, and electronically**



Appeals shall be answered in writing **within three days**, and appeals received less than **six days** before the elections or on Election Day shall be answered immediately



APPEALS AGAINST DECISIONS OF ELECTION COMMISSIONS



Managing body of political party that nominated candidates, candidates, proxies, observers, and voters may appeal **decisions** of election commissions **to district and regional courts** within **five days of the decision**



Decisions of the Central Election Commission may be appealed to the **Supreme Court** within **five days** of the decision



Appeals shall be considered promptly **within three days** of their receipt and no later than **six days** before the elections

HANDLING OF APPEALS



The Central Election Commission has established a **toll-free hotline (call center)** at the short number **1200 for citizens residing in Uzbekistan** and the number **55-500-12-00 for citizens residing abroad**



Citizens have the opportunity to use the call center to identify their precinct and receive other information about the elections in **Uzbek, Karakalpak and Russian**



The hotline of the call center, which started its work on **June 7 this year**, received a total of **432 calls** to the short number **"1200"** (as of 18:00 on 7 of July this year)



Since the announcement of the start of the presidential election campaign, the Central Election Commission has **received 184 appeals** (as of 20:00 on July 7 this year)
